Ladies and Gentlemen,

The NAM member countries have a lengthy relationship that dates back to the 1961 First NAM Summit. As a result of the Summit, we became more independent, able to define our own future, and able to create international connections on our own terms.

It is our goal to continue to improve everybody's agriculture skills and expertise.

Despite the pandemic, the Agricultural Training Project for African, Caribbean, and Latin American Countries was recently scheduled.

Up until the end of October 2021, we will provide at least four virtual training courses-each with two batches-in tissue culture technologies, integrated pest-and-disease management, hydroponic crops, and labelling and packing.

Let me clarify that the NAM Centre is **eager** to encourage deeper cooperation between developing

countries, which is based on common agricultural interests. We will do everything we can to help our brothers and sisters attain the goals of sustainable agriculture.
